Our dual approach combines top-down policy advocacy with bottom-up grassroots engagement. This enables us to create real change at both local and global levels.

Our activities include private diplomacy, operational interventions, capacity-building, sub-granting, research and policy publication, public advocacy, and convening through events, speeches, and conferences.

We focus on long-term transformation in people, policies, and institutions. While we have established programmes, we remain open to new partnerships aligned with our mission. With this in mind, we actively participate in peace and democracy networks and remain attuned to global trends and innovations.

Strategic Objective 1

Empowering Youth to Build a Peaceful, Sustainable Future.

The Challenge We See

Peace is under threat. Violent conflicts are not only increasing in numbers, but also in severity and duration. War is now waged in a way that exacerbates civilian harm. With half the world's population under 30 and 8 billion people expected to be born over the next 50 years, harnessing young people's creativity and commitment to positive change is essential for building sustainable peace. Young people are already playing a crucial role in preventing violence, fostering peace and reconciliation, and advocating for climate action and equitable economies. Yet they remain excluded from leadership and decision—making, contributing to feelings of marginalisation and, at times, instability. Young people cannot claim their place at the table on their own: other stakeholders must help them develop the skills, build the networks and access the resources needed to transform the structures that hold them back.

The Impact We Seek

By 2029, we will foster meaningful youth engagement, support youth-led networks, and equip young people, especially young women, with the tools to lead peaceful, cohesive, and resilient communities.

Our Theory of Change

When young people participate in shaping their future, societies become more peaceful, inclusive, and resilient.



Strategic Objective 1: Empowering youth to build a peaceful, sustainable future.

Inputs

KAF applies its expertise on the prevention of violent extremism (VE) to new contexts and identifies and supports partners to act in countries affected by violent extremism.

Outputs

Extremely Together chapters are established and active in the Sahel; PVE work in Uganda was deepened and expanded to neighbouring DRC and potentially wider areas.

Outcomes

Thousands of young people in these countries are empowered to stand against violent extremism and build peaceful, inclusive communities.

KAF identifies, trains and supports young leaders who are working to bring positive change at the local, national or global levels.

Every year, 12-14 young people join the Kofi Annan Changemakers and receive training, mentoring and seed grants. Programme Alumni are offered further opportunities for training and resources, and to participate in key forums. A Global community of young activists who embrace and embody the *Kofi Annan Way.*Their capacity to lead and build change is scaled up.

KAF designs and delivers new projects to support young leaders who work on building peace and social cohesion, or who address key youth challenges.

Young people in Lebanon engage in the restoration of historical landmarks and are trained to foster social cohesion. Training and seed grants are provided to young mental health practitioners in Eastern Africa and later to other regions

Skilled young leaders drive positive change in their communities by promoting social cohesion, safeguarding cultural heritage, and expanding mental healthcare services.

KAF advocates for a new local and international focus on the link between youth, peace and climate.

KAF supports young people in the Sahel, East Africa, South Asia, and Southeast Asia in tackling the impacts of the climate crisis and conflict by strengthening community resilience and building sustainable livelihoods.

Young people in these countries are equipped with the skills, networks, and resources to strengthen community resilience and influence decision-making on peace and climate action.

Impact

Young people's leadership strengthens peace, resilience, and inclusion in societies.

Despite challenges, overall support for democracy remains strong. It is still regarded as the best system to address global issues, ensuring progress on human rights, security, economic inclusion, and climate action.



Strategic Objective 2

Turning Back the Tide of Democratic Erosion

The Challenge We See

Democracy is in global decline, with multiple reports indicating a weakening of democratic values and processes. Young people are losing faith in political leaders, institutions, and the electoral process, leading some to consider hostile activism as the only viable avenue for change. This has fueled the rise of populist leaders in wealthy nations and multiple coups in West and Central Africa. New and established democracies struggle to meet citizens' expectations, which increases social tensions. Despite these challenges, overall support for democracy remains strong. It is still regarded as the most effective system for addressing global issues, promoting progress on human rights, security, economic inclusion, and climate action.

The Impact We Seek

By 2029, we aim to strengthen democratic institutions, improve electoral integrity, and promote informed and engaged citizenry. Our work will reinforce accountability, uphold human rights and the rule of law, and promote information integrity.

Our Theory of Change

A supportive political climate, as well as informed and prepared actors, enable peaceful elections and increase trust in governments, reinforcing democracy.

The Impact We Seek



Strategic Enablers

Nurturing Our People

Our people are our greatest asset. Our Board, comprising leaders from four continents, brings insight, influence, and commitment. They are supported by a small team of 10-12 professionals from diverse backgrounds in the public and private sectors. We plan to maintain this staffing level through 2029. Delivering programmes effectively and efficiently requires this small team to be collaborative, innovative, and energetic; to be well-informed and well-connected; to master skills and competencies in our work areas; to embrace Kofi Annan's values and internalise a culture of respect and continuous improvement. We are committed to developing our staff's essential knowledge and skills to support the implementation of our strategic objectives.

Consolidating our Partnerships

The Foundation works closely with a wide range of partner organisations, including international and regional organisations, foundations, academia, women's associations, non-governmental and grassroots organisations, many of which are youth-led. This gives us access to cutting-edge and local expertise, reinforces our credibility, and allows us to exert influence through our trusted partners. It also allows us to share costs and benefit from economies of scale. Between 2025 and 2029, we will deepen some of our existing partnerships and pursue new ones to ensure coordinated action for peaceful, democratic, and resilient societies. We will also review our operational networks of international technical experts and senior leaders, and consider establishing new Commissions—a format that has proven effective and impactful for the Foundation.



Strategic Enablers

Expanding our Pool of Donors

The Foundation is supported by public and private donors, including international organisations, national and local governments, foundations, and individual donors. As a small entity without endowment, the Foundation's ability to achieve its objectives could be constrained in 2025-2029 by the altered funding landscape, with reduced resources available from traditional donors. We will therefore redouble our efforts to diversify our donor pool. We aim to establish multi-year funding partnerships to cover both the cost of programmes and our core operations, while monitoring closely the latter to reduce overheads wherever possible. We will also continue to exert particular care in ensuring that funding sources are beyond reproach and offer a clear value-for-money proposition. We envisage an annual budget of CHF 2-3 million per annum.

A Global Outlook with an African Focus

Our mission is global, with work that spans every continent. At the same time, many of our country projects are based in Africa — the continent of our founder's birth, and one where our name continues to resonate with particular strength. We are committed to deepening this engagement by establishing a stronger presence on the continent.

Telling Our Story

In an era of misinformation, clear and compelling communication is essential. We will strengthen our digital presence and leverage our new website, storytelling tools, and the voices of our partners and beneficiaries. Using articles, podcasts, videos, and events, we will share our impact and advocate for a more peaceful and cooperative world.
